4. Purpose of and legal basis for processing personal data	<p>The basis for the processing of personal data stored in the register for recording camera monitoring is the pursuit of Fimlab's legitimate interests.</p> <p>The purpose of the recording camera monitoring system is to protect the property of Fimlab Laboratoriot Oy, prevent crime and assist in the investigation of committed offences or irregularities.</p> <p>The recording camera monitoring system also aims to ensure peaceful working conditions for staff, increase their occupational safety and monitor the condition of the property and the durability of the material. For this purpose, footage of persons in the laboratory or its immediacy captured by the camera monitoring system is saved to the register.</p> <p>Treatment/sampling rooms are not recorded. Camera monitoring in non-public facilities requires the consent of persons working there permanently. The camera monitoring system does not record in the bathrooms, and the cameras are only on during supervised drug test sampling. Customers are informed of this.</p>
5. Data content of the register	<p>Footage recorded by security cameras and the time and place of recording are stored in the register.</p> <p>In areas with camera surveillance, there are visible "Recording security cameras in use" signs or labels.</p>
6. Regular sources of data	<p>Data is collected through security cameras places outside and inside the laboratory.</p> <p>Camera surveillance is used in the following locations:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Finn-Medi Delta, Biokatu 4, Tampere

7. Recipients of data	<p>No regular disclosure of data.</p> <p>In the event of suspected crime, data may be disclosed to the police or other authorities with a legal right to access the register. The register is not connected to any other register.</p>
8. Transfer of data outside the EU or EEA	<p>In principle, personal data in the register is not transferred outside the EU or EEA.</p>
9. Retention period	<p>The data collected in the register is stored only for as long as and to the extent necessary for the original or appropriate purposes for which the personal data was collected. Personal data referred to in this privacy policy is stored for as long as the data controller uses it for the purposes specified in section 4. Personal data stored in the register is erased when the legal basis for its processing ceases to apply.</p> <p>Recordings in the register for recording camera monitoring are retained for 30 days on average. In the event of vandalism or other criminal offences during the retention period, a recording may be stored for as long as required by the investigation.</p>
10. Principles of protection	<p>Appropriate technical and organisational measures have been taken to ensure the information security of the register and the confidentiality, integrity and accessibility of the personal data collected.</p> <p>Electronic material is protected securely so that it can only be accessed from the organisation's intranet.</p> <p>The access rights to the organisation's information systems and files are based on personal access rights, the use of which is controlled. Real-time video surveillance and recordings are only monitored by the person responsible for the register.</p> <p>Databases are maintained by the IT service provider. Fimlab Laboratoriot Oy's guidelines on data security and data privacy are observed in the storage of data.</p>
11. Right to access and rectify data (Article 15 and 16)	<p>The data subject shall have the right to know which of their personal data have been stored in the register. The request to access data or have data rectified is submitted by sending a written request to the Data Protection Officer (tietosuoja@fimlab.fi).</p>

<p>12. Right to erasure (Article 17)</p>	<p>The data subject shall have the right to obtain from the controller the erasure of personal data concerning them without undue delay if</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the personal data is no longer necessary in relation to the purposes for which it was collected or otherwise processed; • the data subject withdraws their consent on which the processing is based, and where there is no other legal ground for the processing; • the personal data has been unlawfully processed; or • the personal data has to be erased for compliance with a legal obligation in Union or Member State law to which the controller is subject. <p>The request to have data erased is submitted by sending a written request to the Data Protection Officer (tietosuoja@fimlab.fi).</p> <p>Despite the request to have data erased, the data controller may be entitled to continue the processing personal data stored in the register based on a legal reason under Article 17(3) of the General Data Protection Regulation.</p>
<p>13. Right to restriction of processing (Article 18)</p>	<p>The data subject shall have the right to obtain from the controller restriction of processing if</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the accuracy of the personal data is contested by the data subject; • the processing is unlawful and the data subject opposes the erasure of the personal data and requests the restriction of its use instead; • the controller no longer needs the personal data for the purposes of the processing, but it is required by the data subject for the establishment, exercise or defence of legal claims. <p>The request to restrict the processing of data is submitted by sending a written request to the Data Protection Officer (tietosuoja@fimlab.fi).</p>
<p>14. Right to withdraw consent (Article 7)</p>	<p>The data subject shall have the right to withdraw their consent at any time. The withdrawal of consent shall not affect the lawfulness of processing based on consent before its withdrawal.</p>
<p>15. Right to data portability (Article 20)</p>	<p>The data subject shall have the right to receive the personal data concerning them, which they have provided to the data controller in a structured, commonly used and machine-readable format, and have the right to transmit this data to another controller, if possible. This right shall apply to personal data that has been processed automatically and based on consent or for the purpose of implementing an agreement. After submitting their request, the data subject must identify themselves at the data controller's service point in order to verify the identity of the applicant in accordance with the data controller's instructions or, alternatively, the data controller may require the data subject to provide any necessary additional information to verify the applicant's identity due to the delicacy of the data requested.</p>

<p>16. Right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority (Article 77)</p>	<p>The data subject shall have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority if the data subject considers that the processing of personal data relating to them infringes the General Data Protection Regulation.</p>
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
